The problem

European elderly care experiences labour shortages, lack of qualified healthcare workers and a major mismatch of capacity and demands in healthcare services, causing stress, burnout, and reduced mental health and wellbeing among healthcare workers, leaders, and informal caregivers.



The need

Research-based tools, interventions and training are needed to help healthcare leaders to map, understand, and act upon capacity-demand challenges.



The solution

The Support4Resilience (S4R) proposal aims to improve healthcare worker well-being and patient safety by supporting leaders in reframing working conditions and organizational structures. By focusing on organizational-level interventions, S4R can address the root causes of stress and burnout. This approach promotes adaptive capacity, resilience, and mental health, ultimately leading to better patient outcomes.



Support4Resilience Toolbox

The S4R Toolbox is an online platform offering cost-effective tools to empower leaders with actionable strategies to enhace resilience in eldery care.



Mapping and Identification Tool

combines insights from healthcare workers and informal caregivers to provide a comprehensive view of the organization's current state.



Reflection and Education Tool

provides contextual understanding of 'work-as-done' and educational components to identify effective solutions for bridging capacity-demand gaps.




Re-organization Tool


Novelty beyond the state of art

Methodology

The S4R project will use a mixed-methods approach to develop and evaluate a toolbox for supporting healthcare leaders. This methodology aligns with the Medical Research Council's guidelines for complex interventions, emphasizing adaptability and context-specific solutions.




S4R Resource Bank


